RULES & REGULATIONS OF ISC BOARD

- All candidates for the Pass Certificate in Class 12th must enter and sit for English (compulsory), with three, four elective subjects and must have been evaluated internally by the School and secured a pass grade in Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service(SUPW) (compulsory).
- No candidate shall be permitted to change his/her subjects(s) after 15th September of that year in which the candidate has registered in Class XI.
- No candidate shall offer a subject in Class XII which he/she has not studied in Class XI.

CONDITIONS FOR PASSING

- PASS CERTIFICATES will be awarded to candidates who at the ISC Examination attain the pass standard in four or more subjects which must include the subject English and have attained a pass grade in SUPW and Community Service as examined/assessed internally by the School.
- The pass mark for each subject is 35%.
- Minimum attendance required – 75%
- Candidates who have failed to secure a Pass Certificate and have been awarded a PCNA (Pass Certificate Not Awarded) in the current year of the ISC Examination will be eligible to appear for the Compartmental Examination. However, the candidates should have passed in English and two other subjects in the ISC Examination in order to be eligible to appear for the Compartmental Examination.
- In the Compartmental Examination, the candidates will be permitted to appear for ONE subject only.

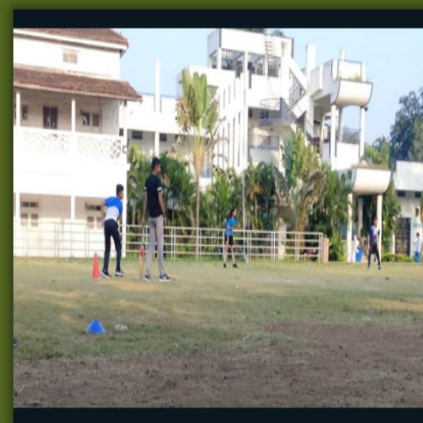

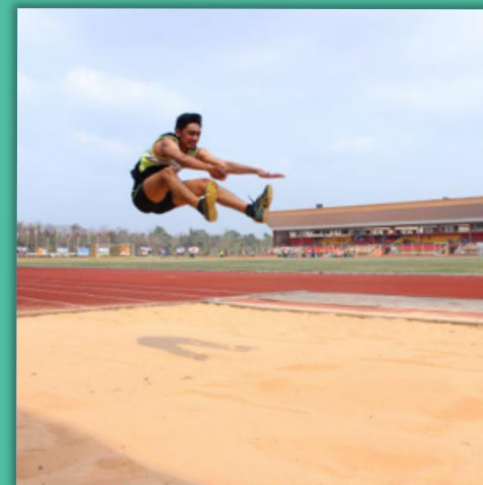

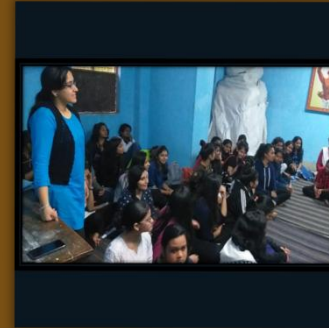

FILLING PROVISIONAL ADMISSION FORM

- ❖ Click on provisional Admission link on the Hutchings Website.
- ❖ On Registration page click on preadmission button and register your name and create user id and password.
- ❖ Login with details you created and click on the Junior College Admission form and fill the required details- name, stream, subjects etc.
- ❖ Upload documents like- Birth certificate, Bonafide Certificate, Class 9 Final marksheet, marksheet of last exam given in Class 10 and Photograph . Click on submit.
- ❖ Pay Registration fee.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR JUNIOR COLLEGE

- 1. Students are expected to come regularly, punctually and in proper uniform.
 - **Girls / Boys Uniform:** Black & White striped full sleeves shirt, Black jeans, White plain knee length socks, Black sports shoes, Junior College tie.
 - Boys must have their hair trimmed and girls with long hair should have ponytail or plaits, nails must be cut, and no nail polish must be applied.
- 2. Use of mobile phones is not allowed in the school campus. Students carrying mobiles must deposit the same, in the office before commencement of classes. Any student found with mobile will face strict action and the mobile will be confiscated.

3. Minimum 75% attendance in regular theory and practical classes is compulsory otherwise, students will not be allowed to appear for examinations. Students who have been absent the previous day must bring a note of explanation without fail. In case of illness a Medical Certificate should also be sent.
4. Students are allowed to park their vehicles inside the school premises if they have a driving licence. Helmets are compulsory. Bicycles with proper lock system can be parked in the area provided.
5. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence, habitual late coming, leaving the school premises without permission, disobedience and any type of unruly and objectionable behaviour is prohibited.

6. Damage to the school property caused by the students will be duly recovered from them. In the event of collective damage to school property in classroom, the entire class will be charged the cost of damage.
7. A vigilant outlook should be maintained towards keeping the surroundings clean. All waste papers should be picked up and thrown into the dustbin.
8. Ragging, bullying and any other activities which may cause distress to other students is strictly prohibited.

9. Students must take part in physical exercise, games, sports and all other activities of the school in order to learn sportsman spirit, boost self-confidence and develop physical strength. They must attend lectures/ seminars/ workshops/ functions arranged by the school, for overall personality development of the students.
10. English is a medium of instruction. To acquire proficiency in spoken English, all students must compulsorily converse in English in school. Students must use decent language all the time. He/she must ensure that his/her speech is courteous and polite.

11. No picnics, excursion, or tours shall be arranged without the prior written permission of the principal. If students join an unofficial picnic or tour, the school shall not be responsible for anything that happens in the picnic or tour. No students shall collect money as contribution to picnic, trip, get-together, study notes, charity, or any other activity without the prior written permission of the principal.

12. The school authorities reserve the right to amend, repeal or modify any of the above rules.
